### **3. Bicycle User Groups – David Wieser**

- David is looking to begin employer Bicycle User Groups (at MEC, etc). This will create a pool of resources for Bike to Work Week, and provide bike safety and other information sessions for employers. David is in conversation with Jessie Klassen from RCM. RCM's resources can help this.
- This will be modeled after the Toronto Bicycle User Group (BUG) network.
- David will talk to Tim Woodcock (MCA Recreation & Transportation Director) who is developing an inventory of Bicycle Friendly Businesses.

#### **4. UofM Environmental Awareness Week – March 23<sup>rd</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup>**

## 15. Green Leap Forward coordinator

- A hiring process is underway for a coordinator/communications person to oversee and connect all the AT events in Winnipeg in May and June. Resource Conservation Manitoba is leading this initiative.

## 17. Membership renewals – Rob Cosco

- Bill Spornitz has set up a BttF PayPal account. People will be able to purchase or renew a BttF membership online.
- Bill is working on how to organize (within the membership database) who is paid/unpaid, a volunteer, etc.
- Rob is getting ready for a phone-a-thon to contact all 2008 members (including the special members from Bike to Work Day) who have not yet renewed for 2009.
- Letters have gone to all bike shops; Jon Benson and Rob Cosco will contact them individually. The ones they have spoken with are willing to give free membership to every purchaser of a bike, and to have BttF membership forms and our *Cycling Advocacy for Winnipeg Citizens* brochure (<http://biketothefuture.org/news/archives/2008/12/17/cycling-advocacy-for-winnipeg-citizens>) in the store. Negotiations about store discounts for BttF members are still underway.
- **Volunteer opportunity:** Rob is looking for volunteers to make phone calls in mid-March.
- **Action item:** Jackie will research and organize the printing of 5000 to 10000 copies of the brochure. Our membership form is almost two years old, so it may need to be updated.

## 18. Plan Winnipeg – Mark Cohoe

- A meeting was held with Ian Hall earlier today.
  - A new Plan Winnipeg process is beginning shortly. This will be a 1.5 year process, built up from scratch. Ian Hall (BttF member, City staff who is working on Plan Winnipeg) came to speak to us prior to today's Monthly Meeting about the new Plan Winnipeg revisions. This document is being completely rethought, and will include:
    - More specific policy directions
    - A focus on sustainability issues.
    - Public participation. April 25 "symposium on sustainability"
  - A section within the City of Winnipeg Charter requires a high-level guiding tool for long-range planning. This document is typically called Plan Winnipeg, and it informs planning decisions set under it. There is typically a hierarchy of plans, and these start as general broad plans, and the policy directions with each type of plan get more specific. They do, however, continue to align with each other. These are:
    - Development plans (like *Plan Winnipeg*)
    - Neighbourhood plans/Action Plans
    - Zoning by-laws
- There has been a typical disconnect between the current Plan Winnipeg, and what happens "on the ground." This new plan will have measures and targets. [ihall@winnipeg.ca](mailto:ihall@winnipeg.ca) 986.2280

## 19. Winnipeg cycling map – Ted Mann

- The committee is finishing sidebar information.
- Comment from Anders: This map is an important advocacy tool, and it is important to highlight the information. The proposed AT infrastructure map will be included, but it is a concern if this is identified on the map as a 'bike route' because nothing has happened to these streets. It is important that this map shows (through colour) that what **exists** is different from what is **proposed**. This is great also for 'popping' colour.
- There was agreement that this is an important consideration, because a map is a political tool and we want to reflect the work that has been done, and hold people accountable to what still needs to be done.
- Distinction could be made between proposed networks that are functioning and not functioning. This can be reflected in parameters given to designer.

## 20. ATAC – Anders Swanson

- An ATAC meeting was held to discuss Rapid Transit initiatives, specifically the routing of the AT pathway next to the Rapid Transit line. See the letter from Curt Hull at <http://biketothefuture.org/design-for-the-future/bttf-publications> -- 2009, City of Winnipeg. It's important that the AT route avoids two choke points: Pembina-Jubilee Underpass and Osborne Street Underpass.
- The Rapid Transit line will cross Osborne Street via a 200m tunnel, but the AT pathway is not currently included in that tunnel cost reasons and Environmental Design principles (sightlines, personal safety), despite being promised when this project was unveiled.
- The City does not have any design standards, so the AT pathway design is currently not wide enough to accommodate multiple forms of transport. This is not a good precedent.
- Summary: The most direct route for bicycles is not being planned for. The engineering company will look into alternate ways for bikes to access the AT pathway, but there are no promises.
- It seems like politicians are not being held accountable to what they told the public. We could draw attention to the gap between the plans and what was told to us. We should start advocating now. What further actions can we take? Do we have a preferred design option?
- **Action item / Volunteer opportunity:** We need someone to research what was told to the public, reports to council, and other background information: read minutes from council meetings where this was adopted, get quotes from politicians, etc. **Note from Karin:** I believe that a bunch of newspaper articles and press are on the Rapid Transit Coalition website, at <http://www.winnipegrapidtransitcoalition.ca/resources.html>.

## 21. Ciclovía / *Ciclovía on Ice* – Jackie Avent, Kevin Miller

- *Ciclovía on Ice* is how Janice Lukes describes the Assiniboine River Trail on the weekends. (Ciclovía: <http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Ciclov%C3%ADa> , <http://www.streetfilms.org/archives/ciclovía/>). This *could* exist on land. BttF and the Winnipeg Trails Association created signs and put them up along the River Trail. They encourage people to call politicians.
- Before Christmas, Resource Conservation Manitoba facilitated discussion meetings about Ciclovía in June, but convincing the City to support it was a big impediment: waive the cost of closing streets, etc.
- Recently, the Downtown BIZ has started selling the City on a smaller Ciclovía with far fewer major street closures. They hope to hold up to three Ciclovías this summer. An initial meeting with all interested stakeholders and supporters will be held on Thursday February 19<sup>th</sup>. BttF will have reps at it.

## Provincial Committee Report – Jeremy Hull

### Provincial Budget Submission

A short budget submission was sent to Finance Minister Greg Selinger with copies to all Manitoba MLAs in December. We received a response on February 3rd. James Beddome (a BttF member and Leader of the Green Party of Manitoba) also sent the Minister a letter in support of our submission. Our plan is to contact a number of other organizations to solicit additional letters of support.

### Delegation to the Legislature

In September we requested a second opportunity to make a presentation to members of the NDP caucus as we did last March. We have been added to their list but we understand that the actual date will still be a ways off. We plan to make presentations to other parties at about the same time.

### Provincial AT Advisory Committee

BttF received a letter several months ago from Jim Rondeau, Minister of Science, Technology, Energy and Mines, indicating that the government is in the process of establishing a provincial Active Transportation Advisory Committee and that we will be invited to participate on this committee. No further contacts have been made to this point.

## **City Committee report – Mark Cohoe**

### **River Heights – Fort Garry Ward By-election**

We met on January 21<sup>st</sup> to discuss a general strategy for the River Heights Fort Garry by-election, and determined that our best option would be to hold a “meet and greet” type meeting with each of the candidates where we could engage them in a discussion of the opportunities and challenges related to AT in the ward. The idea is that this would be educational for the candidates and less formal than a questionnaire, with an emphasis more on sharing information. A second part of our plan is to create an AT issues primer, which can be distributed at various meetings and published on the BttF website (and other websites if necessary). Janice Lukes has had initial contact with the candidates, and we are hopeful that both will agree to a meeting and that they may even help publicize the events. The AT Issues Primer is a little behind schedule at the moment, but I hope to get an initial draft out before Friday. With the general election set to be held in October 2010, hopefully this by-election can serve as a dry run for a similar ward-by-ward approach in 2010.

### **Plan Winnipeg**

The city is in the process of updating its vision document, Plan Winnipeg, which was last updated in 2001. The City has let us know that they want Bike to the Future to be involved in the process, and to that end we will be meeting with a city representative (who happens to also be a BttF member) for an informal discussion about the process and how Bike to the Future can be involved. We are very fortunate to have within our membership a number of people who were involved in the last update of Plan Winnipeg and have offered to take part in our involvement/advice for this round of Plan Winnipeg.

### **Infrastructure Renewal and Public Works Meeting March 10, 2009**

Looking ahead, it is expected that the city will release their list of Active Transportation projects for 2009 at the March 10, 2009 meeting of the Infrastructure Renewal and Public Works Committee.

### **Downtown Bicycle Lanes**

Kevin Nixon has let me know that he would like to hold one more stakeholders meeting regarding implementation of the downtown bike lanes. The purpose of the meeting would be to discuss how the lanes on Hargrave/Carlton worked, and to make suggestions for both the existing lanes and the planning of the Fort/Garry lanes.

## **Safety & Education report – Dave Elmore**

There has been no change in the status of the Can-Bike program or instructor training. The 5 BttF members who have completed all of the training required for certification still must write the exam. We are waiting on Howard Skrpnik to prepare the testing. It is still the goal to have this completed in time for spring. BttF will continue to work with MCA and the Provincial Government (through Howard Skrpnik) to look at reviving the Can-Bike program in Winnipeg/Manitoba.

In discussion with Howard Skrpnik, it appears that the wheels are in motion for the production of a Winnipeg cycling safety video. Dates have not been set, however there will be a winter riding component to this video so it can be assumed that production will get underway very soon.
